EDUCATIONAL GRANTS FOR SURVIVING FAMILIES REQUIREMENTS

- Must be the spouse, son, or daughter of a sworn full-time certified law enforcement officer who was employed by a law enforcement agency within the geographical boundaries of Miami-Dade County, Florida at the onset of the illness, injury, or time of death. Law enforcement agencies include federal, state, and local.
- For the son or daughter of an officer, grants are provided up to the age of 26.
- The student must attend an accredited vocational/technical school, college, or university and have at least a 2.5 GPA.
- The student shall become and maintain throughout each school term, the status of full-time or part-time student. Full-time attendance is considered four or more courses during the fall or winter/spring semester. If attendance is less than full-time, the amount of assistance will be pro-rated based on the number of registered classes.
- The student must complete the Application for Assistance Non Line of Duty Survivors and submit to the POAT office along with all required documentation.
- The Educational Committee will review and submit the application for approval to the Board of Directors at their next scheduled meeting. After a determination is made, the Committee will advise the student of its decision in writing.
- One grant for the fall semester and one grant for the spring semester will be awarded each year.
- Any and all grants shall be made directly to the educational institution or vendor whenever possible.
- First time applicants are required to provide:
 - Completed application
 - Latest transcript
 - Course schedule
 - Statement of charges from the school
- To continue to receive grants for subsequent semesters, the student must maintain a minimum 2.5 GPA and submit updated transcripts, course schedule, and statement of charges at the end of each completed semester. Upon review of the documentation, POAT will send payment according to the terms that were previously approved.
